

WVLX Market Report

Prime Cattle - 1st of November, 2021

Total Yarding: 451

The same reduced field of buyers operated on the similar sized, mixed but mainly good quality offering of 451 cattle, 12 more. Demand was strong for some restocking young cattle but the others overall averaged 20c/kg cheaper amongst fluctuating competition. Grown steers were 10c to 20c cheaper and the cows together with grown heifers lost 40c to 50c/kg.

Most better quality young cattle sold between 38oc and 45oc to processors and from 39oc to 535c to restockers with top sales of theirs at 596c and 60oc/kg. Plainer quality and dairy bred young cattle were mainly between 29oc and 39oc/kg.

Well covered grown steers made 434c to 466c with restockers paying to 480c/kg. Older and heavier bullocks were at 385c and 400c while Friesians sold for 320c and 340c/kg. The beef bred grown heifers were from 368c to 412c and restockers paid to 428c/kg.

There was a large percentage of beef cows and they sold from 314c to 375c while the few dairy cows made 318c and 320c with poor to plain quality from 214c to 280c/kg. Beef bulls were from 345c to 366c/kg.
